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Unity means that a congruity or agreement exists among the elements in a design; they "look" as though they Visual Unity / Harmony / belong together, as though some visual connection beyond mere chance has caused then to come together. Composition Another word for the same idea is Harmony. If the various elements are not harmonious, if they appear separate or unrelated, your pattern falls apart and lacks unity. Unity in design is planned and controlled by the artist. Sometimes it stems naturally from the elements chosen. More often it reflects the skill of the designer to create a unified pattern from varied elements. Another word for "design" is the word Composition, which implies the same feeling of organization. Just as "composition" in a writing class is not merely a haphazard collection of words and punctuation marks, so a visual composition is not a careless scattering of random items around a format. **Class Discussion** We will be looking at the art of Armin Hofmann. We will look for similarities and differences in their use of Source and Subject Visual Unity and Composition.
